12. Special policies due to the COVID-19 human epidemic:

The primary mode of transmission of coronavirus infection among humans, similar to the spread of influenza and other respiratory pathogens, is droplet infection: saliva droplets and respiratory secretion droplets containing the virus, released into the air during the cough or sneeze of an infected person.

To the best of our knowledge, infection with the new coronavirus causes mild, flu-like symptoms in about 80% of cases, but is fatal in 2-3% of cases.

The most common symptoms of the disease are fever, chills, dry cough, shortness of breath. Sore throat, muscle aches, nasal congestion and fatigue may also occur. **If you experience following symptoms** on your own or your partner, especially

- if you have a fever of 38 ° C or higher, cough, shortness of breath; the symptoms occured suddenly, regardless of the severity of the disease, and
- you were in close contact with a person with confirmed or suspected new coronavirus infection in the 14 days before the onset of symptoms.

please inform the campsite manager immediately by telephone or e-mail of the campsite, but in no case personally!

The campsite staff is obliged to make the necessary official notifications in accordance with the relevant legislation. The management of the campsite may revoke the right of the guest or those accompanying the guest to stay in the campsite in order to protect the health of other guests.

In order to create and maintain safe operating conditions, the access to certain services and the capacity of the campsite may be limited by the management of the campsite!

It is important to pay attention to compliance with the following, for a safe rest for you and the other guests:

- pay close attention to personal hygiene
- frequent, thorough soapy hand washing is the most important way to prevent infection.
- take advantage of the online booking and payment options and choose the cashless payment method if possible
- observe the posted information on site and follow the regulations
- maintain a safe distance of at least 1.5 meters
- at the reception, only one person of a family or accompanying guests must join the queue
- wear a mask and gloves indoors if required. (it's not obligatory)
- use hand sanitizers in the campsite regularly.
- maintain the appropriate safety distance in sanitary buildings and other service rooms (communal kitchen, fireplace, etc.).
